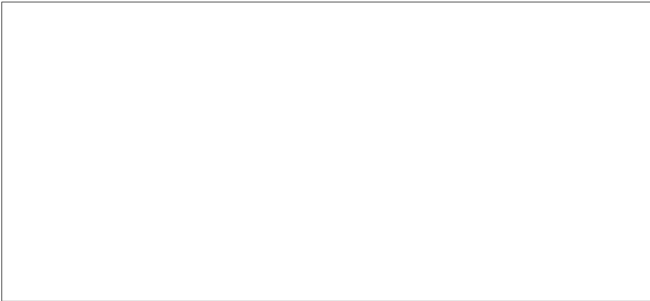
### Meetings
